## **Resources and articles of interest**

READ: <u>NIH-funded study highlights the financial toll of health disparities in the United States</u>. This study is the first to estimate the total economic burden of health disparities for five racial and ethnic minority groups nationally and for all 50 states and the District of Columbia using a health equity approach. Read the key findings <u>HERE</u>.

- EXPLORE: <u>The Building Movement Project</u> has been advancing the potential for nonprofit organizations to have an impact in building movements for progressive social change. Explore their tools and trainings <u>HERE</u>.

- WATCH: <u>The Tools to Help Community Based Organizations Access Federal</u> <u>Resources Webinar</u> focuses on best practices for CBO's to influence and access federal resources, including both how to position your organization to receive federal or other government funds, and also how your organization can work with states, local governments, and other recipients of federal funds to ensure these dollars support community-led projects and needs.
- READ: <u>The Financial Health of Community Based Development Organizations</u> <u>Technical Report</u> by the Urban Institute describes the process of creating the universe of community-based development organizations (CBDOs) used for the financial health study and a planned national survey.
- READ: SPARCC (The Strong, Prosperous, And Resilient Communities Challenge) is a multi-year initiative investing in and amplifying local efforts to ensure that new investments reduce racial disparities, build a culture of health, and prepare for a changing climate. In this report, they assert that <u>Inclusive</u> <u>Investment Starts with Equitable Community Engagement</u>.

These tools assess areas such as an individual's health status, beliefs, attitudes and behaviors; personal and community factors; and access to services.

- Health Resources and Services Administration, U.S. Department of Health and Human Services announces an opportunity to apply for funding under <u>HRSA-23-112</u>: Maternal Health Research Collaborative for Minority-Serving Institutions (MH-RC-MSI) Research Centers (RCs) and HRSA-23-113: MH-RC-MSI Coordinating Center (CC). The purpose of the Maternal Health Research Collaborative for Minority-Serving Institutions (MSIs) is to establish a multiinstitutional research network that is comprised of and supports minority-serving institutions (MSIs) to build their capacity to conduct research addressing disparities in maternal mortality, severe maternal morbidity, and maternal health outcomes and to find community-based solutions to address these disparities and advance health equity. **Application deadline**: June 12, 2023. **Apply <u>HERE</u>**.

- The NIH announces an opportunity for funding via <u>Community Level</u> <u>Interventions to Improve Minority Health and Reduce Health Disparities (R01 -</u> <u>Clinical Trial Optional</u>). The purpose of this initiative is to support research to develop and test community-level interventions to improve minority health and reduce health disparities. **Application deadline**: Jul 7, 2023 5:00 pm local time. **Apply <u>HERE</u>**.
- The Office of Minority Health (OMH) is seeking applications for projects funded under the <u>Healthy Families Community-Based Perinatal Health Initiative (COPHI)</u> to develop innovative models for integrating community-based maternal support services (COMSS) into perinatal systems of care. OMH will award up to \$10,000,000 to support up to 10 awards, ranging from \$975,000 to \$1,250,000 annually for a project period of up to four years with the possibility of an optional

competitive fifth year for transition to sustainability. **Application Deadline**: July 18, 2023 6:00 pm ET. **Apply** <u>HERE</u>.
