A SUCCESS STORY FROM THE FIELD

The Tucson Child Health Working Group, led by Activate Tucson and the University of Arizona College of Public Health explored the current Public School Tax Credit policy and system. This helped determine how to make the policy and system more equitable for schools in need of additional support for programs that address healthy lifestyles and weight. A policy brief with recommendations along with an implementation guide and an evaluation were created to inform and advocate for changes that would improve the current policy and system. The team is now in conversation with local and state representatives to discuss change, and continuing to work with local tax professionals to educate their clients in order to increase donations directed to underfunded schools.

Tips and Tools

Is it time to write a grant proposal for your organization or coalition? Consider these 5 tips from professional grant writing consultant,

<u>Carolyn Owens:</u>



- 1. Follow the directions carefully answer questions in the same order, use the same headings, definitions and buzzwords, make sure you do not exceed page limits, follow formatting, etc.
- 2. Make clear links between the grant/funder priorities and how your program supports it
- 3.Can a layperson understand what you are saying? **Don't assume reviewers are experts**
- 4. **Less is usually more**, be succinct in all narrative
- 5. Make sure reviewers can quickly and easily understand WHO you are, WHAT you do, WHERE you are, and HOW and HOW MANY are served/impacted

As you're thinking about applying for grants, we've got a great new tool for your "toolbox"! <u>The Grants Decision Matrix tool</u> gives you a place to think about key elements within the core components of decision making: Organizational Level, Financial, and Programmatic. The grid layout aims to support your decision making when assessing your organization's readiness in applying for a grant.
